The EU Pet Passport is a helpful document that identifies your pet's health status, making travel within the EU and select European countries easier. Remember, while it simplifies things, do check and meet the specific entry rules of your destination for a smooth journey!





Getting a Microchip

Microchipping is mandatory for pet cats in the EU, ensuring traceability and safety by linking a unique identification number to your contact information, facilitating easy and safe travel within EU countries, requiring adherence to ISO standards and verification during travel or when entering an EU member state.

Ensure to Have a Valid Rabies Vaccination

To travel within the EU, your pet cat must have an up-to-date rabies vaccination. Ensure your cat is microchipped before administering the vaccine; otherwise, you might need to revaccinate her after microchipping.
